The Inventory Analyst will oversee inventory management procedures and assist with generating inventory reports for internal and external reporting. The Inventory Analyst's main responsibilities are to maintain the accuracy of records pertaining to overall production as well as shipments of finished goods. The role will require adherence to Pure Sunfarms Corp's internal and external regulatory requirements. The position will be required to co-ordinate across multiple departments (Compliance, Finance, and Operations). This position reports to the Regulatory Compliance and Financial Reporting Manager.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

- Maintain accuracy of the Inventory Management System as it pertains to finished goods on hand as well as shipments of goods to customers
- · Perform reconciliations between finished goods produced, sale of goods, and all other classes of inventory
- Assist staff with Inventory counts of finished goods to ensure the Inventory Management System is being accurately reflected
- Use analytics to investigate, test/validate reports
- Use BI tools to design and automate reports
- Extract, summarize and reconcile data from the Inventory Management System
- Continuous improvement of inventory procedures and practices
- Assist in inventory data collection and review to aid in reporting to regulatory bodies (Health Canada, CRA, and Statistics Canada).
- Review and assess entries into the Inventory Management System for accuracy
- Ability to work as team member in a fast-paced, growing environment

OTHER DUTIES
